Set against the backdrop of the Ozark hills, Batesville offers a peaceful small-town vibe with a rich cultural scene. As Arkansas's oldest city, it has been acclaimed by USA Today as the "Best City to Live in Arkansas." Batesville's strategic location near the intersection of Interstate 40 and Interstate 55 makes it an ideal stop for travelers exploring the region.

Batesville, Arkansas, is situated in the northeastern part of the state, approximately 94 miles north of the capital, Little Rock, and about 121 miles west of Memphis, Tennessee. Nestled in the foothills of the Ozark Mountains, Batesville is a picturesque town with a rich history and a vibrant community. The White River runs east and west of the city, offering scenic views and recreational opportunities for residents and visitors alike. Batesville enjoys a temperate climate, with mild winters and warm summers, making it an ideal location for outdoor activities year-round.

Independence County, where Batesville is located, is home to a strong manufacturing sector. Bad Boy Mowers is the brand that revolutionized the zero-turn lawn mower game. It was the first to market zero-turn mowers to rural landowners and homeowners, not just commercial users, with a simple promise of a better mower at a better price. Bad Boy quickly became the fastest-selling mower in America, expanding its engineering expertise into other categories such as tractors, the Bandit UTV, and the E-Series of 80-volt handheld tools. Known for sporty design, uncompromising power, relentless innovation, and a signature attitude, Bad Boy's slogan is "Power. Performance. Attitude."

Flowers Baking Co. of Batesville, LLC is the largest commercial bakery in Arkansas, employing a significant workforce and supplying quality baked goods to a five-state region. Serving major retail and foodservice customers like Walmart, Kroger, Burger King, and Chick-fil-A, the bakery operates over 160 sales routes. In 2022, the company received the U.S. Department of Energy's Better Practice award for innovative energy management, resulting in substantial energy and cost savings. 
Batesville Regional Airport (BVX) is located three miles south of the central business district. It is a city-owned, publicuse general aviation airport spanning 375 acres. The airport has two runways, one of which offers multiple instrument approaches.

Independent Stave Company's Batesville Mill is a prominent manufacturing facility with a workforce of 68 dedicated individuals. Operating on a two-shift basis to meet the dynamic demands of the bourbon industry, the mill

purchases and receives white oak logs daily, crafting barrel staves and heading. The company takes pride in its active role within the Independence County community and looks forward to future opportunities. A family-owned cooperage reaching customers in more than 40 countries, Independent Stave Company was founded by the Boswell family and continues to embrace its core values of family, innovation, community, and hard work.

Independence County benefits from a robust financial sector, with seven financial institutions serving its residents. Overall deposits in the county have seen significant growth, reflecting the region's economic vitality. The Association of Arkansas Counties underscores that agriculture reigns as the county's leading industry, with particular emphasis on beef and poultry production and processing.

Poultry processing operations in Batesville serve as significant employers, not only for the town but also for the broader state of Arkansas.

Peco Foods, counted among the largest poultry producers in the United States and ranking among the top five poultry companies operating in Arkansas. Peco Foods has a significant presence in Independence County, employing 1,211 workers across its two facilities. Together, these plants churn out an impressive 36.5 million pounds of chicken every week.

Ozark Mountain Poultry (OMP) provides employment to over 1,000 local residents. Since its establishment in 1984, the Batesville complex has consistently produced more than 5 million pounds of chicken annually, with a focus on antibiotic-free and non-GMO poultry products at an affordable price point for consumers.

Custom Craft Poultry (CCP) offers unique products that are not readily available from larger processing plants. Their approach blends handcrafted and machine processes to craft distinctive goods that cater to various consumer preferences. Their recent expansion has positioned CCP as a key player in the market, providing high-quality, unique products to a broader consumer base. Their focus on customer satisfaction is reflected in their ability to create custom products tailored to meet specific client needs. With a state-of-the-art facility and a team of experienced professionals, CCP continues to set the standard for excellence in the poultry processing industry.

Established in 1974, the Independence County Senior Citizens Program operates four centers in Batesville, Oil Trough, Newark, and Cushman, with Batesville as headquarters. Services include meals, transportation, wellness activities, and social events. In 2023, the program served approximately 350 seniors, delivering 23,713 meals, serving 7,744 onsite meals, and providing 7,501 rides. The program aims to increase awareness of aging issues, enhance transportation, and offer health promotion and social activities. The highly anticipated new senior center in Batesville is currently under construction and will allow for expanded offerings.

#### **HISTORY COMES ALIVE**

Independence County is steeped in history, with architectural gems and historical sites that captivate visitors year-round. Discover the oldest water-powered gristmill in the state at Spring Mill, lovingly restored to its former glory and now a splendid event venue.

The Old Independence Regional Museum (OIRM) focuses on over 200 years of the rich history of Independence County. With a gift shop, 10,000 square feet of interactive exhibits, and a robust archive of books and documents open to the general public for research purposes and school field trips, OIRM has been a favorite local site for 25 years.

In 2023, OIRM was chosen by the Smithsonian Institution's Museum on Main Street as one of only six museums in the United States to showcase its FOOD exhibit, titled "A Taste of Community." This exhibit blends the Smithsonian's outstanding photos and text with local stories, pictures, and hundreds of artifacts from our local community, showcasing the history of food in the region.

#### **LOCAL EDUCATION**

Education thrives in Independence County, with four exceptional school districts: Batesville with 3,123 students, Cedar Ridge with 630 students, Midland with 468 students, and Southside with 2250 students.

The Batesville School District is home to seven schools, each committed to putting students first and providing customized learning experiences for every individual. From infancy through graduation, the district prioritizes the growth and success of each student, supported by a strong sense of community. Sulphur Rock has expanded its preschool offerings, meeting a crucial need for childcare while enhancing early education opportunities. Recent accolades, including the prestigious District of the Year title from the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission and the receipt of Home Visiting Awards through the Investing in the Power of Families Grant, underscore the district's unwavering dedication to educational excellence with students at the forefront.

The Cedar Ridge School District in Newark, Arkansas, serves students from preschool to twelfth grade across 270 square miles, including Charlotte, Cord, Magness, Newark, Oil Trough, and Thida. Despite changes from annexation and consolidation, the district receives strong community support, providing unique learning opportunities. Recent improvements include a new Early Childhood Center, campus upgrades, and 1:1 technology. Students also benefit from partnerships with Arkansas State University - Newport and University of Arkansas Community College at Batesville for concurrent and dual credit courses.

Located on Highway 167 between Batesville and Bald Knob, the Midland School District offers exceptional education with growing numbers and academic achievements. The district's preschool program, starting from six weeks old until kindergarten readiness, includes an infant room, a wobbler room, and a 64-capacity preschool. Midland Elementary's outstanding teachers have led students to top scores in math and reading in kindergarten in the North Central Cooperative for two consecutive years. The high school has raised its state letter grade over the past year, continuing to enhance teaching and learning.

The Southside School District, consists of four schools: Southside High School, Southside Middle School, Southside Elementary School, and Southside Charter School. The district is dedicated to providing a quality education that prepares students for future successes, offering a variety of programs and services to meet the needs of its diverse student population. Known for its above-average test scores, the district continues to rise in academic achievement. The high school operates as a conversion charter school. Currently, the district is in the construction phase of the fourth and final phase of the new high school project, which includes a new cafeteria dining space, band facility, art room, sports arena, family and consumer science/agriculture facility, and other career and technical spaces.

Additionally, Batesville offers three distinguished private schools–Montessori Christian Academy, Presbyterian Day School, and Batesville Montessori School–providing families with quality educational options.
